The King's School West Rand provides a world class Christian education based on 4 pillars: Academics, Skills, Spiritual Formation and Biblical Worldview. Let's take a look at the academic programme. Our academic programme is designed around much more than information transfer, it is focused on creating young adults who are able to evaluate learning material within a Christian Worldview and apply their knowledge in real-life situations for redemptive purposes.

1. Grounded in Gods Mord.

Everything that is taught will acknowledge that all truth is God's truth, and must seek to direct students to the centrality of Scripture, the goodness of God and his good desires for his children.

2. Discipleship.

Children will be trained to be disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, not just adherents to Christian values. They will be encouraged to take up their cross and follow Jesus. Teachers will strive to model a godly example.

3. Learning not grading.

Our goal in education is to promote learning in our students, and assessment is not primarily a grading activity, it is a secondary activity designed to provide feedback on the learning process. We will be deliberate and purposeful in striving to make every experience of our children a learning experience, whether it be in curriculum engagement, student activity, student-teacher interaction, student socialisation with peers, executive function coaching, etc.

4. Deep not broad.

We will teach knowledge and skills with an emphasis on deep not broad covering key learning outcomes thoroughly rather than superficial teaching on a broader range of learning outcomes. We will exercise a preference for learning to mastery rather than learning to competency.

5. Formation not information.

We will regard the education process as an all-encompassing endeavor, far beyond the imparting of information, but composed of numerous carefully planned activities designed to be formative growth experiences. Some formative learning outcomes will be: creativity, resilience, confidence, problem-solving skills, socialisation skills, cooperative teamwork, displaying fruits of the Spirit, etc.

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CAR PARK RULES: DROP-OFF ZONE

- 1. Please drive to as far forward as possible before dropping off your child, preferably just past the security hut. This helps us to load 6 cars into the drop-off lane rather than 4, and thus minimises the back-up of waiting vehicles.
- 2. Please let your children be ready with all their belongings to disembark once you stop in the drop-off lane. Each vehicle should not need to be stationery for longer than 5 seconds in the drop-off lane.
- 3. As the driver, do not get out of your vehicle in the drop-off lane. If your child can't open the boot on their own in order to get their bag, they should have their bag with them in the car.
- 4. Please be considerate of other drivers. When you stop in the drop-off lane, quickly glance over at the queue of waiting vehicles and do what you can to help them to move along quickly.
- 5. Please allow a cushion in your time planning so that you don't make your child late for lesson one. Leaving 5 minutes earlier from home will save on your stress levels and save on your child's embarrassment.
- 6. When using the drop off zone, as well as the school parking area, please respect the Security guard and staff on duty. They are doing their very best to assist you with the process of getting the job done as smoothly as possible.
- 7. We would also like to again appeal to our parents to not parallel park (Behind other parked vehicles in the parking bays) in the middle of the traffic flow in order to drop- off in the non-designated areas, as this also creates a back-up of vehicles. Rather make use of the available parking bays and let the learners walk the small distance to their allocated entrances.
- 8. We have noted that the parking area fills up rather quickly and becomes extremely congested mainly for the last 10 minutes before school starts -that is between 07.20 and 07.30. It would therefore make perfect sense to try and beat the rush by arriving before 07.15.
- 9. Most of our parents must be commended for following the rules and doing their part to alleviate the stress before school in the morning and for that we are really thankful.


