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From the Principal's desk



Students will learn more effectively and will benefit for longer if they train themselves to engage the heart in their learning. Parents should be encouraging their children to develop 5 habits that will enhance learning right from the classroom experience.

RECEIVING. Students should go into classes with a readiness to receive. They need to adopt the posture of a learner. Paying attention, listening actively, asking questions for clarity and making notes are all part of a positive learning posture.

RESPONDING. All learning demands a response. If there is no response, then the learning will soon be lost. Responding is asking the questions "how do I feel about what I've learnt?", "what can I do with what I've learnt?" and "how can this information help us build a better world?"

VALUING. This happens when students begin to associate a deeply felt value related to the learning material. Valuing normally happens when we *reflect* on the learning material. Often teachers will build into their lessons a time of reflecting where students have group discussions with an emphasis on the beliefs and values they hold with respect to the topic being presented. This is also the step of learning where biblical integration happens.

ORGANISATION. Students will encounter learning material where more than one value is present. Organisation is a part of engaging the heart in learning where students think about the *interrelationships* between values and which value is *dominant*.

INTERNALISATION OF VALUES. As students learn more about a topic, they internalise and solidify the values that they hold and further develop ideas, beliefs and attitudes in line with their value sets. This is the step of learning where an overarching *biblical worldview* of all life and reality is shaped.

If students are able to cultivate these processes into their learning, they will not simply be focused on memorising facts in order to pass tests, but they will experience formational learning where their character will be shaped and they will become motivated to use what they learn to make a positive change.
