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From the Principal's Desk

A child's education is a two-handed process.

Dear parents

We often talk about the partnership between parents and the school, and the significant importance of communication in this partnership. Strong parent-teacher/parent-school relationships are imperative for the success of any school, especially Christian schools.

The difference between theory and practice is that many good "ideas" or principles fail. On paper, something might make perfect sense, but the implementation or practice often looks different. Jesus came to earth for many reasons, but I believe that one of the reasons was to show us what life with God looks like.

An area where I believe the practical often falls short of the theory is the parent-teacher/parent-school relationship. Life is busy, things happen, schools are different, children grow – but this remains something that we as the adults in the lives of the children under our care have to intentionally and constantly work at improving.

I read an interesting post by author John Rosemond that speaks to this relationship. I'd like to share it with you:

"There's been lots of talk about the need for parents to become supportively involved in their children's education. As a result, parents are asking, "How should we get involved, and how can we best demonstrate our support of education?" The best way to get involved, the best

way to support the efforts of your children's teachers, is to put first things first. At home, concentrate on building strong foundations for learning and excellence by teaching the "Three R's" of Respect, Responsibility, and Resourcefulness. As I've said time after time, teachers cannot do what parents are supposed to have already done at home. Teachers can only capitalize on what parents have already accomplished and are continuing to reinforce.

A child's education is a two-handed process. On the one hand are those responsibilities that belong to the child's school. On the other are those responsibilities that belong to the child's parents. Only if the school and the parents join hands effectively will the child be able to accept those responsibilities that belong to him."

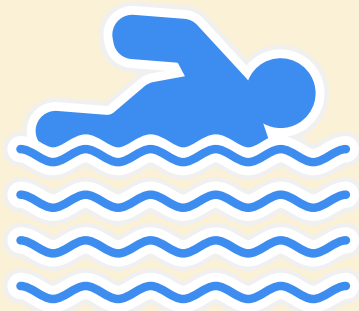

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Grade 7 Outing

For students attending private Christian schools, the environment is often familiar, structured, and rooted in faith. But what happens when a student from The King's School West Rand steps into a government hospital for the first time? Not as a patient, but as a volunteer? One student reflects on this eye-opening experience, highlighting the differences between these two worlds and how it humbled her to put herself in others' shoes.

As a twelve-year-old student at The King's School West Rand, I had never been to a government hospital. While I had heard about the importance of community service, I had never directly participated in an outreach programme. That changed when our school organised a visit to Yusuf Dadoo Hospital in Krugersdorp.

I quickly realised that the world is not all sunshine and rainbows. We started making sandwiches at 05:30 to be ready for our transport at 06:00 so we could serve patients arriving before their doctors' appointments.

As we prepared and wrote small notes of God's love on the sandwich bags, I was nervous. Actually, we all were. We didn't know what to expect.

When we arrived, the hospital looked clean and hygienic. Waiting for us at the entrance was the CEO, Dr Pheto. He was friendly and welcoming, taking the time to show us around and explain the purpose of each ward. The doctors were incredibly engaging and made us feel comfortable. With sandwiches in hand, we met many sick patients waiting to see the doctors. We

quickly started handing them out, and I soon realised what a small act of kindness can mean.

The hospital has made great strides by renovating parts of the wards, progressing bit by bit while serving many patients.

At King's, we often talk about serving others, but witnessing it first-hand was completely different. We realised that some experiences might make us uncomfortable, but we can overcome them.

Reflecting back, as we handed out the sandwiches, the patients' smiles made me feel at ease. This experience opened my eyes to the struggles of accessing health-care for many in unfortunate circumstances. The early hours they had to sacrifice to see a doctor made me appreciate how blessed we are and reminded me that even small gestures can bring comfort to those in pain and, in some cases, fighting for their lives.

Mrs Knight, Mr Valentine and Mrs De Wet accompanied us, looking proud of how respectful we were. They were also touched by the number of volunteers willing to learn, strive, and assist.



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Our visit to the hospital began with nerves and uncertainty but ended with valuable lessons on gratitude, empathy, and the power of service. As I returned to school, I shared my experience with classmates. I want to inspire others to step out of their comfort zones and reach out to those in need.

For us, stepping beyond familiar surround-

ings was eye-opening and nerve-wracking. This experience reminded me that the world beyond our school is diverse, complex, and filled with life lessons worth learning. I know this experience will benefit me one day, and who knows what else the future holds.

I would wholeheartedly do it again, eager to share the light of God with everyone.

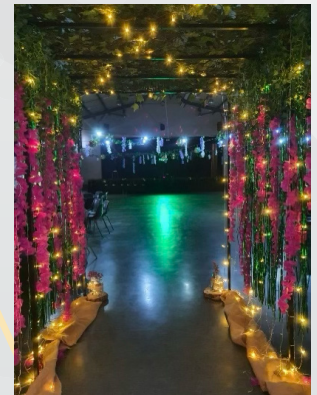
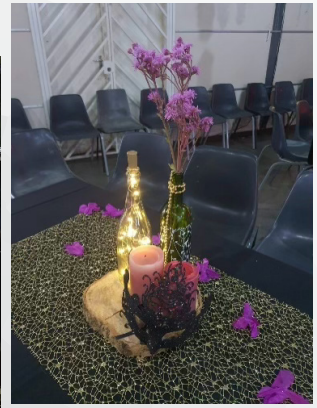
Our High School students arrived in their numbers and brought the glitz and glamor on Saturday evening, 15 February 2025.

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SPORT CORNER : WHAT HAPPENS WHEN IT RAINS?

Mr Botha is the only person who has the authority to cancel activities. Sport and Recreation Officers will monitor lightning and communicate with Mr Botha timeously.

Protocol for Rainy Days before 12:00

Grade 1 – 5:

Where possible a decision will be made by no later than 12:00 to cancel OUTDOOR activities. In cases such as these most Parents have sufficient time to make arrangements to collect their children at the end of the school day. However, ALL staff who are team managers are required to remain on duty for the duration of the specified OUTDOOR extra mural and look after the children who have not been collected from school by the end of the academic day.

A Whatsapp message will be sent to the HOD's of the Foundation Phase and the Intermediate Phase notifying them of the cancellation. The HOD's will then forward that message on the Whatsapp Parent Groups.

The Sports and Recreation Officers will notify external coaches, medics, cancel transport and catering requests and communicate with the Receptionist with regards to the whereabouts of the children.

Protocol for Rainy Days after 12:00

If it starts raining after 12:00 and there isn't sufficient time for Parents to collect their children after school, ALL staff who are team managers are required to remain on duty for the duration of the specified OUTDOOR extra mural and look after said children until the parents collect them. Sports and Recreation Officers/Team Managers will inform the Receptionist of the whereabouts of the children in their care so that Parents can easily locate their children.

Grade 6 – 12:

OUTDOOR Extra Murals will NOT be cancelled regardless of the weather. Team Managers and Coaches need to be prepared to deal with classroom sessions on wet days. Team building, team strategy and game play discussions etc. will be held during this time.

Attendance by players on these days is still a requirement for Team Selection. Normal team protocols for absenteeism will be followed.

Learners in these age groups may be collected after the extra mural ends in accordance with the Extra Mural Timetables.
